

ICD-10 for Enhanced Historical Search in PPE

What's Changing

The U. S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) has finalized the adoption of the International Classification of Diseases – 10th Revision (ICD-10) code set, which will replace the current ICD-9 codes as of October 1, 2015. The new code set contains 5 times as many codes as ICD-9.

This means that when using the Enhanced Historical Search, users will be able to search by ICD-9 and ICD-10 codes to return the correct procedure set. An ICD-9 code may either have an exact ICD-10 equivalent or multiple possibilities for more specific ICD-10 codes. If there is more than one ICD-10 code, a crosswalk mapping tool will allow the user to select the appropriate codes.

This functionality will be enabled on September 24, 2015 to allow for client testing and practice.

1:1 Match

In cases where there is an exact match from the old ICD-9 code to the new equivalent ICD-10 code, the ICD-10 code will be listed in the search results.

One-to-Many Match

If there is not an exact 1:1 match for a code, the following crosswalk mapping tool will appear after entering your search criteria. The crosswalk tool will display your options for equivalent ICD-10 code(s).

The ICD-9 displays at the top of the crosswalk tool for reference purposes only. Select the applicable scenario, then click **ok**.
